

#### What is the Goods and Services Tax?

- As the name suggests, it is a tax levied when a consumer buys a good or service.
- It is meant to be a **single, comprehensive tax** that will subsume all the other smaller indirect **taxes** on consumption like service tax, etc. This is how it is done in most developed countries.

#### What is preventing GST from being a reality?

- A major change like GST requires a **constitutional amendment**, which requires a bill to passed in both houses of Parliament. W. Ambition AS. com
- The GST constitutional amendment bill was passed in the Lok Sabha in May this year.
- It has been held up in the Rajya Sabha due to objections being raised by the Opposition regarding the Bill as well as issues with no direct connection to GST.
- The Bill was also placed before a Rajya Sabha select committee, which made its recommendations regarding changes to the Bill. The Cabinet cleared these changes in July.

#### What are the Opposition's objections?

- The Congress wants a provision **capping the GST rate at 18 per cent** to be added to the Bill itself.
- It also wants to scrap the proposed 1 per cent additional levy (over and above the GST) for manufacturing states.
- This levy was demanded by manufacturing states who argued that they needed to be compensated for the investment they had made in improving their manufacturing capabilities.
   The Centre had agreed to this demand to encourage the states to support the GST Bill.
- The third demand by the Congress was to change the composition of the GST council—the

body that decides the various nitty-gritty's like rates of tax, period of levy of additional tax, principles of supply, special provisions to certain states, etc. The proposed composition is for the Council to be two-thirds comprised from states and one-third from the Centre.

- The Congress wants the Centre's share to be reduced to one-fourth.
- This demand, however, was rejected by even the Rajya Sabha Standing Committee.

#### Call for pact on emission cuts

- USA and China called for an agreement that would cut carbon emissions and pave the way for a global transition to a green economy.
- China emits about 30 per cent of the world's greenhouse gases and the U.S. about 16 per cent.
- In a joint announcement last year, Mr. Obama pledged to cut U.S. emissions up to 28 per cent over the next decade, while Xi announced China would cap its growing emissions by 2030 or sooner.
- French President **Francois Hollande** called for a **progressive tax on carbon** to reflect its true price, and send the message that there is a cost to emitting greenhouse gases damaging the environment.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi, while inaugurating the India Pavilion at the COP21 event, said India intended to make massive changes to its energy profile by increasing the share of renewables, achieving 175 GW by 2022.

### Nepal shortages put millions of children at risk: UNICEF

- Severe shortages of food and vaccines due to border protests have left millions of children in quake-hit Nepal at risk of disease or death this winter, UNICEF said

# Is climate change to blame for Syria's civil war?

- Prince Charles, for one, seems to think "There is very good evidence indeed that one of the major reasons for this horror in Syria was a drought that lasted for about five or six years,"
- Climate change is having a "huge impact" on conflict and terrorism.
- First, most of the public and policy discourse on the conflict implications of climate change is driven by politics, not science.
- There was a multi-year drought during the late 2000s across the "fertile crescent", a region defined by the authors as stretching from southern Russia to Saudi Arabia.
- Crucial among these is that pre-war drought in Syria led to the displacement of as many as 1.5 million people to the country's cities.
